The use of a professional photographer is encouraged. Photo & Logo Specs

- **Best:** 8" x 10" at 300 dpi (2400 x 3300 pixels)
- Minimum accepted: 3" x 5" at 300 dpi (900 x 1500 pixels)
- Photos cannot be downloaded from your website due to the lower res quality

Format & Submission

- Preferred format is jpg or tiff; only high resolution (300 dpi) pdf files
- Email to media@omsanctuary.org as an attachment, **not** embedded

► Headshot

- Please provide a color, focused, clear headshot (portrait). There should be space on all sides of your head and there should be no accessories (sunglasses, hats, etc) present.

► Action Shot(s)

- Please send a few action shots **in addition** to your headshot. These are half or full body figure shots and may include professional or studio shots from teaching, yoga, dance, performance, etc.

► Additional Notes

- Please make sure your photos are not more than 2 years old
- Only color photos are accepted
- Digital files are preferred - Mailed in photos will be returned only if included with a return envelope containing the appropriate postage
- We cannot guarantee which photo(s) will be used and all photos submitted to OM Sanctuary constitutes permission to be used in all marketing collateral
- Photographers and artists are encouraged to submit images of their artwork
- Musicians and authors are encouraged to submit images of any book or CD covers from the last 3 years
- You are welcome to submit your website link though we cannot guarantee it will be used
